RECONVENED MEETING BLOSSBURG MUNICIPAL AUTHORITY NOVEMBER 14, 2023

The reconvened meeting of the Blossburg Municipal Authority was held on Tuesday, November 14, 2023 at 6:00 PM in the Council Room.

The following members were present: Chairman M. Stoudt, Vice Chairman J. Bubacz, Jr., Secretary S. Hall, Treasurer P. Bauman, and member F. Wasowicz. Also present was G. Lloyd, Borough Manager and Recording Secretary L. Lazouras.

Section 4: Borough Manager's Report

A.) George and S. Bray went to the stp pump house to check the concrete in the two basement floors, in the wet well. They took videos. The concrete does not look bad for being over 50 years old. There are a few spots with holes to be fixed. Down the road, like five years or so, they can shut down one side and work on it, then do the other side. George will not get ahold of Abel Recon. Matt keeps the plant very clean. The contractor is really happy, and Matt is there and learning as they build.

When we had a regular meeting with the contractors, they asked when they have substantial completion on the pumps, if we would take over the warranty. There is an extended warranty for 6 months which costs about \$4,500. RUS did not have a problem with this suggestion. M. Stoudt said he would have the information clarified as far as the word substantial. He does not like this idea and prefers the completed work. There are times Matt gets called out for plugs in the comminutor and has to dig out the clarigester. S. Hall also feels we should not agree to any substantial completion but keep with the original plans for the entire project. The final completion is to be by May 2024. J. Bubacz agrees and hopes Matt can get as much training as he can from the contractors. Our next meeting is 12/5, and the next construction meeting is not until 12/12.

George discussed the STP generator and its capacity. Everything is on the same line but will feed both places. The new plant will have one line and the pump house another. Mike said it will detect either place and if the power were to go out, to either or both, it would go over to generator power, and then can go on standby power. It was asked what will be done with the old infrastructure, but he and S. Bray are looking at it for another possible use.

There being no further business, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 6:15 PM on motion by S. Hall, seconded by P. Bauman, with all in favor.
